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## □ Mission

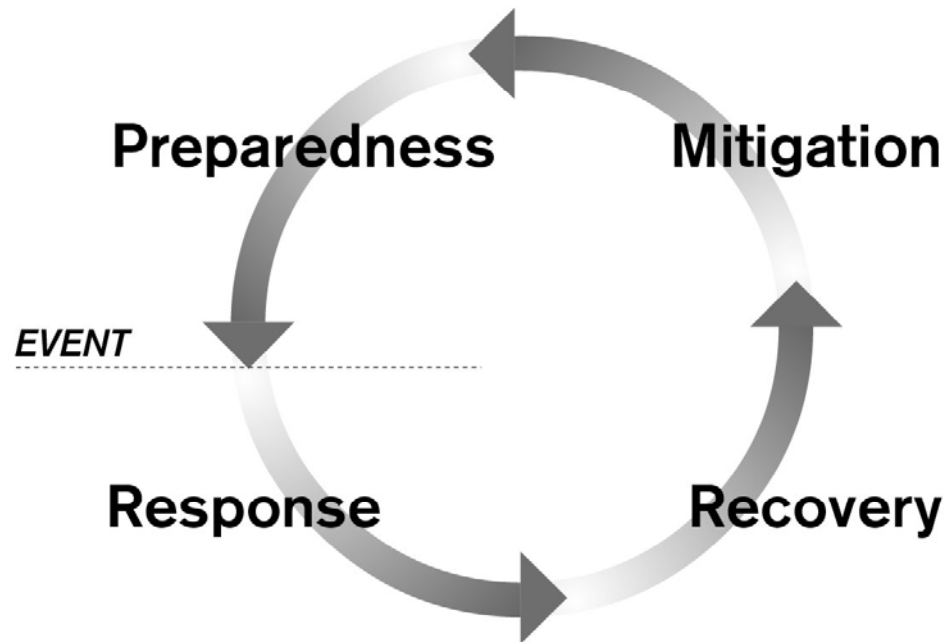


To systematically assess campus vulnerabilities and develop holistic and integrated solutions aimed at making the University of Oregon more disaster resilient and sustainable.

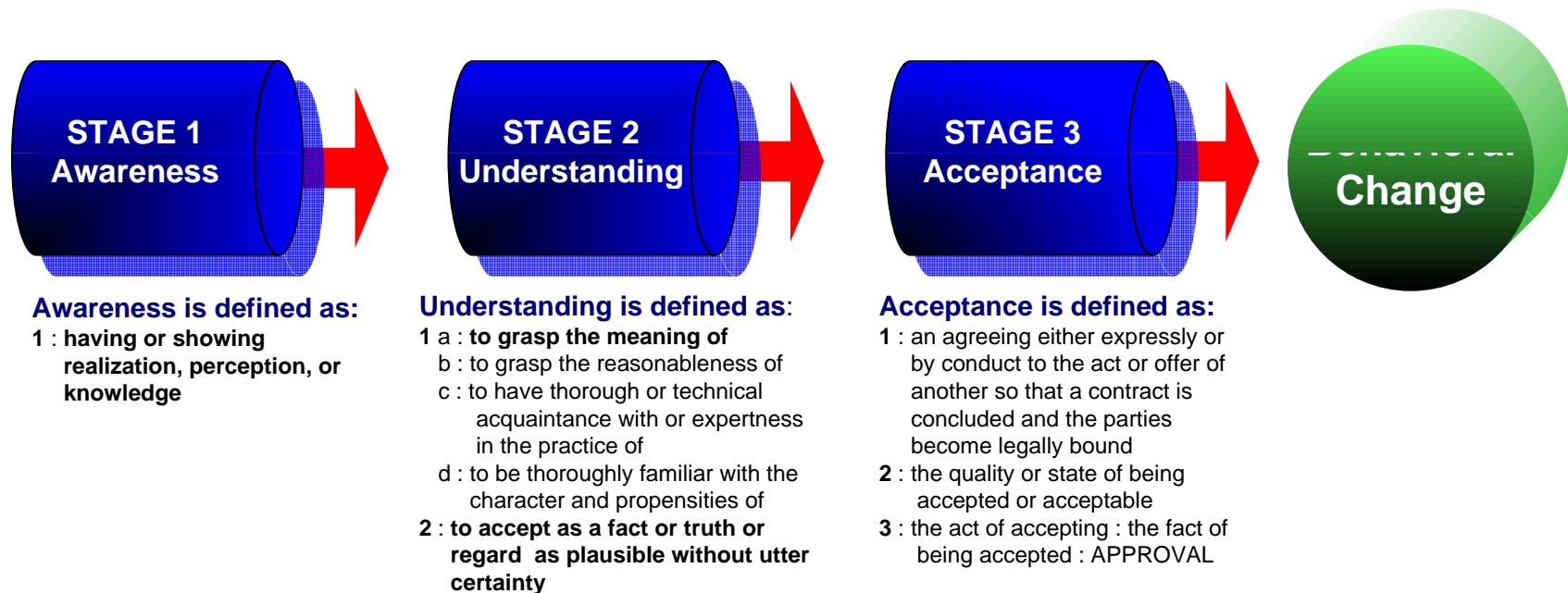
# A systems approach

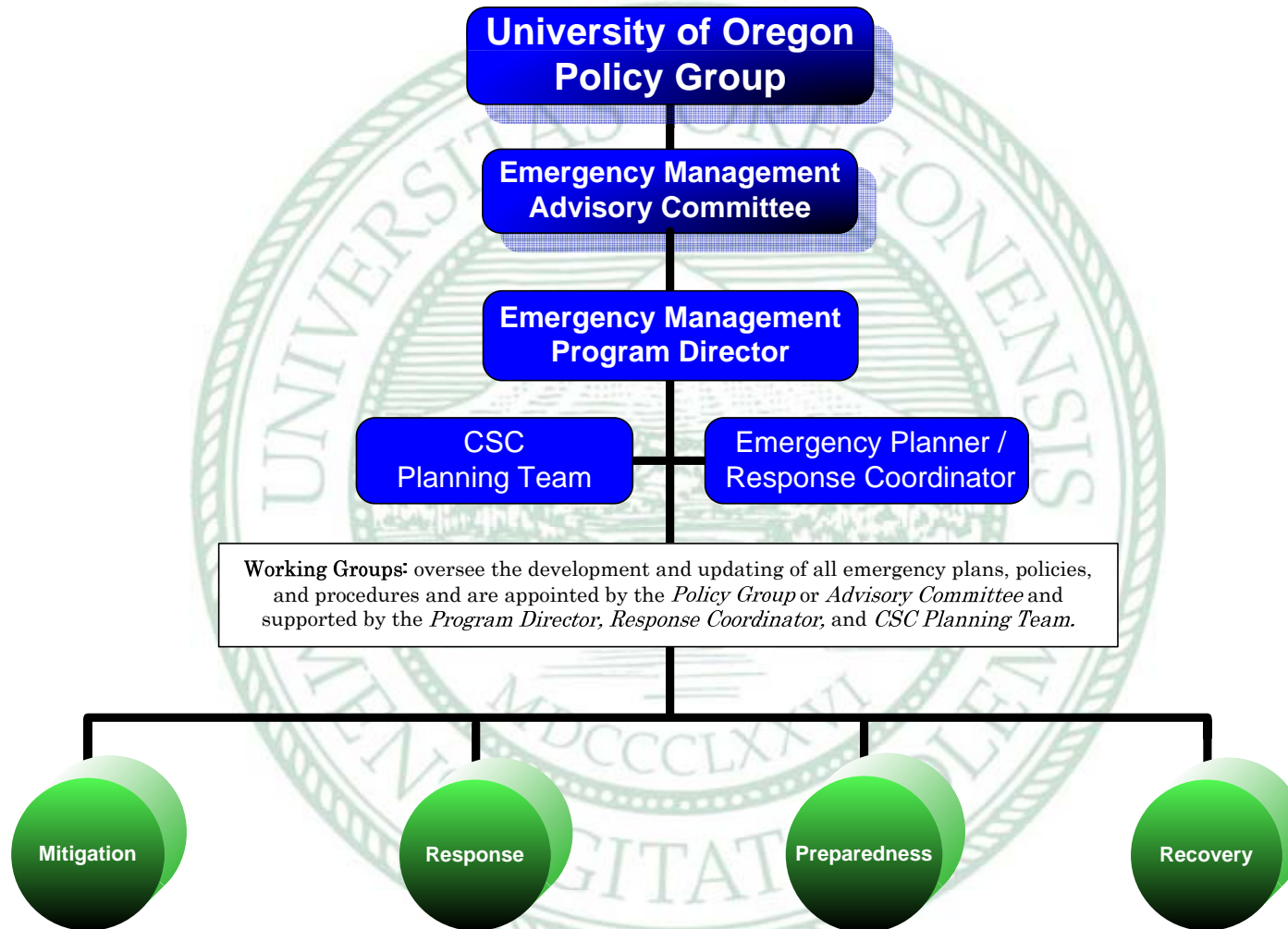
